SUBJECT: Faecal Pancreatic Elastase test - change of measurement platform notification

Dear Customer(s),

The faecal pancreatic elastase test will no longer be a sendaway test from 18th November 2019. It will be performed by the Department of Specialist Chemical Pathology at LabPlus.

This change allows the introduction of automation in the analysis process and has a shorter turnaround time. It will also do away with the screening slide test and will be cost saving. Although the new immunoassay method is different from the in-use method by the referral laboratory, the performance of the new method with respect to classifying patients into "normal (>200 ug/g wet stool)", "borderline (between 100-200 ug/g wet stool)", or "suggestive of moderate to severe exocrine pancreatic insufficiency (<100 ug/g wet stool)" remains essentially the same.
